4. Trip for CABOLT: Toward the end of the meal, [] brought up the matter covered in Reference. Although he was determined and blunt in the exposition of his ideas, this is his manner of speaking and it does not necessarily mean that he intends to ram his ideas through any possible opposition by force. He supported his suggestions with the arguments outlined in Reference and with a few frivolous arguments, such as his statement that if we accomplished nothing else we could impress CABOLT by showing him the industrial might and overwhelming area and population of Germany's new ally. In reply to []'s suggestions, which were buttressed with the argument that we had sent numerous USWIMLers home on tours, [] replied that he had considered the idea of a trip for CABOLT on a couple of occasions. To be blunt about the matter, he had discarded the scheme because he was afraid that [] would interpret any such gesture as an attempt to subvert one of his subordinates. This placing CABOLT in an uncomfortable situation vis-a-vis his boss. [] admitted that this was a cogent reason for abandoning the idea, but he countered by saying that he would personally undertake a campaign to convince [] that such a trip would be for the good of CAVIRIL. This will take time, as [] will have to work up to the idea slowly, but it should be possible to convince [] in the end. [] said he would discuss the idea with his superiors and determine what can be done.

5. [] was left with the impression that the idea for the trip had originated with CABOLT, and he and [] had devised a sales program along the following lines: [] wants to take us to lunch, so we will accept, as this gives us our opportunity. Let us be very convivial and put him in a good mood with jokes and compliments, wait until he has relaxed from a large meal and some beer, and then we will have him.
