**SUBJECT:** Visit of the President of the West German Security  
Service (BfV) to the United States

1. President Hubert Schrubbers of the West German Security Service (BfV) will make an official visit to the United States at the invitation of this Agency. He is scheduled to arrive in the United States on 19 June 1965 at Dulles International Airport and will depart for Germany from Boston on 6 July 1965. President Schrubbers will be accompanied for the duration of his visit by a CIA escort officer.


2. A biographic sketch of President Schrubbers is attached for your information.

3. The tentative itinerary for President Schrubbers is as follows:

- a. 19 June: Arrive at Dulles International Airport at 1740 hours.
- b. 20 June: Sightseeing in Washington, D. C.
- c. 21-25 June: Briefings at CIA Headquarters, FBI Headquarters, and the Pentagon.
- d. 26-27 June: Sightseeing in Williamsburg, Virginia.
- e. 28-29 June: Briefings at CIA Headquarters.
- f. 29 June: Depart for sightseeing tour to include Cape Kennedy and Redstone Arsenal.

- g. 3-4 July: Sightseeing in New York City.
- h. 5 July: Depart for Boston to visit relatives.
- i. 6 July: Depart for Germany.

4. We have been advised through our liaison channels that your Bureau has designated Tuesday, 22 June, as the date President Schrubbers will visit FBI Headquarters for briefings and discussions, to include an interview with Director J. Edgar Hoover, lunch, and a tour of the FBI facilities. We have noted this on our agenda of briefings for President Schrubbers. We will notify you at a later date where President Schrubbers will be staying so that contact arrangements can be made.

5. President Schrubbers' English is not altogether fluent; and although he can get along in most social situations, he may have some difficulty understanding the briefings. It is therefore suggested that the Bureau have someone on hand who can act as interpreter. Should you so desire, our escort officer, who has worked with Dr. Schrubbers in Germany, could act as interpreter during the 22 June visit.
