<p style="margin-left: 40px;">FYI</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">1. The Soviet vessel M/S "Maria Ulyanova", carrying approximately three hundred passengers - members of the "Soviet Committee for Protection of Peace" - visited Hamburg for the period 30 May - 1 June 1969. The vessel came from Copenhagen, and left for Amsterdam. As far as known, she is also going to visit Oslo, Stockholm, and Helsinki before returning to Leningrad.</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">2. The local "Landesfriedenskomitee" (LFK), supported by other pro-Soviet organizations, had prepared an elaborate program (sightseeing trips, meetings, shopping tours, dinners, etc.) for the guests - ninety per cent of them intellectuals - who were permitted to go ashore in groups ranging from three to twenty persons. CAHELM, who belonged to the reception committee, and who furnished us with a complete itinerary, played host for Identity 1 and two other Soviets. According to him, Identity 1 responded immediately and favorably to his pose (a gentleman of "the old school"), and their friendship developed to a point where they were soon holding hands secretly, and, on her departure, CAHELM was hugged and tearfully kissed. 3. CAHELM described Identity 1 as a well-educated woman (fluent German and English) with whom he could discuss various topics in a straight-forward fashion, including sex. As a matter of fact, Identity 1 confided that she had always wanted to see "a real Western sex movie", but this desire was not fulfilled because the other two Soviets in her group had different interests. According to CAHELM, Identity 1 was very much impressed by what she saw and heard of the German living standard, and honest and frank enough to admit that it was much higher than that of the Soviets. She also confided that she had joined the "Soviet Committee for Protection of Peace" in order to be able to travel and to maintain contact with the "outside world". It was her first visit to Germany, although she has seen the Scandinavian countries on a previous occasion. (Note: We have instructed CAHELM to write a thorough assessment report on her and will debrief him once more regarding all details.)

4. It was learned that CAHELM is an old friend of Identity 2, and that he is also acquainted with Identity 3. Both individuals, whose activities we have monitored through CALLIKAK and [ ] during the past few years, are active organizers of German-Soviet youth contacts and travel groups. CAHELM has been instructed to establish closer and more frequent contact with Identity 2. This, we hope, will eventually guarantee him steady contact to the majority of visiting Soviet youth groups.

5. Any information that the addressees may possess on Identity 1 will be very much appreciated.
