Iron Guard Reorganization in Austria.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">E. Engineer Velescu was recently appointed by Horia SIMA, Iron Guard chief for Austria and presumably for Germany also.</p> <p>Page # 6</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Part. #4</p> <p>Enescu is the former editor of the Iron Guard newspaper "Cuvantul". Enescu is the former Austrian Consul in Vienna, during 1944-1945, of Horia SIMA's German-sponsored Vienna government. Sturza is former Minister of Foreign Affairs in SIMA's Vienna Government.</p> <p>This is taken by the highranking Legionaries in Austria to mean that the abovementioned group undermined SIMA's attempts to reach an agreement with King Michael with an view to their entry into legality and their starting normal political relations with the other Rumanian political parties in exile on an equal footing.</p> <p>It is alleged that Vasile Iasinschi, who is SIMA's ranking assistant, has received SIMA's order to "isolate" the whole group from the rest of the Legionaries.</p> <p>....</p> <p>Page 10</p> <p>In June 1951, Mircea Dimitriu told [] that the "Commandant" (Horia SIMA) had expressed the desire to meet him and asked [] in what countries he could travel. Dimitriu added that SIMA had already given [] a first satisfaction by relieving Velescu from his responsibilities in connection with the "Vestitorul" and by appointing Vasile Mailat in his stead, with whom [] was on good terms, (Mailat is the only Legionary who knows [] from Romania). [] answered that he could meet SIMA in Italy, but Dimitriu replied that either France or Germany would be better. Until the present no further discussions on this subject were held. Several months ago, the Austrian police discovered the tomb of an unidentified man in the yard of a peasant in an unidentified Austrian village, located in the U.S. Zone of Occupation. In the peasant's home the police found a number of books which had belonged to Corneliu Georgescu. There immediately arose the suspicion that Georgescu might have been SIMA's successful plot to seize the leadership of the Iron Guard.
