Beirut Redsox Meeting of 11 April 1953

1. During the meeting in Beirut on 11 April 1953 between [ ], [ ] and [ ] a number of points concerning the ABASTR project were clarified. The meeting was particularly valuable in that it also enabled [ ] and [ ] to discuss problems concerning [ ] and NOSTRIL.
2. [ ] reviewed the development of Nostril and pointed out that [ ] was awaiting the LCFLUTTER report before attempting to implement DIR 42891. Other significant points discussed and agreed upon were the following:
  - a) [ ] will make every effort to solve Nostril's cover problem and keep Hqs informed of progress.
  - b) Nostril is the most logical individual to handle the recruiting as well as the spotting of Jordan's Circassians.
  - c) It is not anticipated that selected candidates will have difficulty departing Jordan.
  - d) Hqs will await [ ]'s recommendations as to the time, place and method of divulging the true purpose of the recruitment of the selected individuals.
3. [ ]'s status was discussed and it was agreed not to include him in the ABASTR planning at this time. [ ] indicated that [ ] will probably immigrate to the U.S. during the next few months and therefore will no longer represent a security hazard. [ ] agreed to endeavor to use Nostril to obtain operational information on the group of Circassians in Damascus of interest to [ ] with the purpose of assisting the latter in his efforts to obtain a reliable spotter-recruiter
