SECURITY INFORMATION

1. On 21 June 1953 a meeting was held in the Arman office of Sulayman Sabulsi. Present were Sulayman Sabulsi, Saadyy Tuqan, Abdullah Mizawi, Abdullah Nawas, and Ishtaiyat.\*
2. The group, led by Sabulsi, discussed the report that Iawfiq Abul Huda planned to return to Amman from Beirut on 23 June 1953. After a lengthy discussion, the group decided to encourage a mob to proceed to the airport and stage a demonstration of protest against Abul Huda's return to the Kingdom. The group also agreed that the best interests of the country would be served if Abul Huda were assassinated on the spot and indicated that they would determine how this could be accomplished.
3. The intentions of the group leaked to the Prime Minister Fawzi al Mulqi who summoned Col. Fadih Sawasah of the Arman Police and instructed him to prevent any attempts to stage a demonstration.

Field Notes:

- \* Sabulsi, presently a merchant in Amman, was a cabinet minister during the 1951 regime of Prime Minister Samir Rifa'i. Ishtaiyat was a Palace Chamberlain of King Abdullah and is presently Mayor of Amman, having recently reinstated in this post after being discharged by Abul Huda. Tuqan, Mizawi and Nawas are Members of Parliament from West Jordan and were members of the anti-Abul Huda bloc in the Government.
- \*\* Abul Huda went to Beirut shortly after relinquishing the Government to Mulqi following the 2 May 1953 coronation of King Husayn.

Field Comments:

Abul Huda did, in fact, return on schedule. Extreme security precautions were observed. Only Government officials, members of Abul Huda's family and close friends were allowed to approach the plane in which he returned. Other passengers on the plane were not allowed to disembark until the Abul Huda motorcade had left the airport.

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
