1. We met NOSTRIL for the last time on 5 June. He is scheduled to depart for Beirut on 6 June and should arrive in New York on the S.S. SATURNIA at the end of June. He plans to stay with a friend upon arrival in New York until such time as he is able to obtain a job.
2. We again wish to emphasize that we feel that NOSTRIL can be of further use to the organization now that he is going to the United States. He has a number of outstanding qualifications especially suited for the intelligence field. His interest is not to get rich quick in America; he wants to provide his family with safety and security and to fight Communism. KUBARK should not overlook the opportunity of assessing the agent upon his arrival.
3. NOSTRIL appreciated the final sum turned over to him on 5 June ( (a) J.D. 15,000 for salary through 15 June, (b) \$500.00 termination and goodwill pay, (c) J.D. 50,000 for [ ] pay for June, July and August 1955). In view of Headquarters' refusal to authorize any termination pay for [ ] , we explained to NOSTRIL that the \$500.00 was also intended for [ ] . He promised to send [ ] \$100.00 from New York when the latter obtains his visa.
4. We appreciated the approval for the termination pay for NOSTRIL but feel that it was a mistake to refuse [ ] any assistance. The man is practically destitute and is unable to work because of his injury. The position taken is, in our opinion, hardly consistent with Headquarters' enthusiasm shown at the time of recruitment. Our recommendation to pay him something stemmed from our feeling that we owed him something over and above the clothing and lodging given him during the assessment period. Provided [ ] is able to obtain his immigration visa in the near future, perhaps the \$100.00 NOSTRIL promised to turn over to him will be sufficient to tide him over.

5. NOSTRIL signed a secrecy oath which we are forwarding under separate cover. He reiterated his appreciation of the faith the Americans had in him and stressed the fact that he hopes to be able to serve the United States Government in the future. He was told that we have been informed by "the friend" in Germany that he will be contacted in New York if there is any opening for an individual of his qualifications. A recognition signal is being forwarded under separate cover.
6. In the event he is contacted, bear in mind that (a) he was never told that we are in contact with anyone other than "the friend" in Germany and (b) he has never been informed that we are connected with KUBARK.
