MEMORANDUM FOR:

SUBJECT : Observations of Student ZAREVICH

1. The undersigned made casual observation of ZAREVICH during the period of training exercise from 17 June to 27 June at Camp A. P. Hill.

2. ZAREVICH frequently made remarks to the undersigned about the stupidity of the training that he was receiving. He stated several times that the subjects that were being taught were too complex for him even though he considered himself one of the best students in the group of eight. He stated further that the instructors were not qualified to teach some of the subjects which they were teaching. ZAREVICH attempted to illustrate this part by claiming that some of the instructors "only read their lectures and couldn't do that very well."

3. During classroom sessions ZAREVICH made every effort to dominate the discussions. He frequently asked unrelated questions and questions which were of such a nature that indicated he had not applied much thought to the problem.

4. ZAREVICH appeared to have an adverse effect on the other students by his contemptible attitude toward the training program. His failure to adjust to the situation was obvious.
