(who was in charge of that office) and also was present Jim if I do recall well, and I believe it was important to correct all necessary uncorrect dates in my biography for future according to them, and of courée I agree with them hundred procent that should be corrected and I thought that I will hear from them a word advicing me to go ahead and make necessary application to the Immigration and Naturalization Bureau, and after passed a considerable time I wrote them a letter in which I expressed my whiches and I asked them if they will help me in-directly as during the our last conversation they mentioned so. But unfurth~~er~~ they did not received my letter. (I send that letter to the followin address [redacted])

Now, I wonder if could spend for me few minutes and talk about it with same concerned ones, just to know theire opinion; Realy if I could learn that they do not have any objection, I think I had same possibilities to go along and put necessary application. Specialty as you should know that U.S. Congress passed few months ago a law which allows immigrants to change same uncorrect dates when they were folsly writing them in order to came to the U.S.A. and I consider my case as one of those few hundred thousand cases for what U.S. Congress was kind enough to consider and give them chances to correct ones forever and become clean forever. If you could't speak with other people for any reason, I wish you could get from them a address through which I could contact them.

Also I am attaching herewith a copy of the letter which I sent to KLM Office New York, asking them for r#fund the same amount of money, and I shall let you know as soon as I hear from them.
