

1. Reference is made to your request dated 3 April 1969 concerning Subject.

2. In a report dated 25 September 1951, a source whose reliability cannot currently be determined, but who was described in 1951 as being generally reliable, furnished the following biographic information concerning Subject. According to Source, Subject completed his secondary education at schools in Riga, Latvia, and Grenoble, France. After entering the Latvian War College, Subject was sent to the French Military Academy, from which he graduated and became a submarine specialist in the Latvian Army. Source said that Subject traveled to Germany in 1941 but returned to Latvia prior to the German occupation. According to Source, Subject was a member of the Abwehr unit which the Germans had established in Konigsberg, Latvia, to precede the German occupation. This source further stated that after the Germans had created the position of Director General of Latvia and assigned General BANKERS to the post, Subject became BANKERS' secretary. Source thought that during the latter part of the German occupation, Subject was conscripted for service into the Latvian Legion, a unit of the Waffen SS. After the war, Subject lived near Rastee, Germany, where he worked in a displaced person's camp which was under the auspices of a British administration. Due to a disagreement between Subject and his superiors in the camp, Subject moved to Baden-Baden, Germany.

in late 1949 or early 1950. According to Source, Subject then met some French colleagues who helped him procure work with a French intelligence service. Source said that in the beginning of 1950, Subject left the French zone and proceeded to Paris where it is believed he attended a "French Intelligence School" for approximately one year. This source concluded that in April 1951, Subject returned to Baden-Baden, Germany, "apparently with some specific assignment."

3. Information received from reliable sources as contained in numerous reports throughout our files indicates that Subject was employed by a French intelligence service from 1949 to 1955. [Comment: The period during which Subject was affiliated with a French intelligence service coincides with the period listed on Subject's personal history statement (as enclosed in the name check request) in which Subject states he was employed by "Direction Des Recherches En Allemagne" (Directorate of Research in Germany.)
