
1. Reference forwarded JAGUAR's notes on its talks with Source in December. The following does not appear to have been previously recorded, although Source claims to have mentioned it in 1961.

2. During WWII the S.D. (Sicherheitsdienst) and in particular Amt III of the RSHA (Reichssicherheitshauptamt), concentrated on penetrating the Polish underground movements in German-occupied Poland and especially those which were under British Intelligence Service influence. An Amt III representative in Warsaw Captain ~~SPILKER~~, was particularly successful in this, and the RIS had little success in picking up the threads of his activity.

3. One of the most important German officers who played some part in this activity was a certain General SIX of the SS whom the RIS had not been able to persuade to talk. In 1960 General SIX was in prison in Poland, but negotiations were underway for his release and return to West Germany. Behind this was an RIS maneuver to infiltrate into West Germany a fellow prisoner of Gen. SIX, who shared a cell with him but who was, in fact, a KGB stool pigeon and who was intended for the role of an illegal agent in West Germany. This agent, who had

presumably gained General SIX's confidence, was himself supposed to be a German or half-German and was allegedly in prison because of war crimes committed by him. This case was being supervised in Poland by a representative of the KGB First Chief Directorate.

~~Comment:~~ ~~SPILKER~~ Certainly identical with Sturmbahnfuhrer Alfred ~~SPILKER~~ of Warsaw Sonderkommando, SiPo, 1939-41. General SIX is possibly identical with Alfred SIX, RSHA Brigadefuhrer in Amt VII (201- although there appears to have been a Lt. Gen. SIXT who may be a better candidate.
