Dear Sir:

The United States Department of Justice, Office of Special Investigations (OSI), is charged with the responsibility of investigating alleged Nazi war criminals residing in this country.

In conjunction with this effort, we are endeavoring to locate any and all documentary evidence which may exist, and is in the possession of the various elements of the federal government.

During the course of this search we have located three reports which were generated by the Counter Intelligence Corps (CIC) or related organizations. These copies have been placed in sealed envelopes and are in the custody of the Central Intelligence Agency. Under the provisions of the Third Agency Rule, the C.I.A. is prohibited from releasing this information to OSI without prior authorization from the originator. In view of the fact that requests to your organization for any and all information pertaining to the subject of the inquiry, Dr. Stanislaw Stankievich, has thus far failed to locate some or all of these specific reports (as they may have been destroyed) it is requested that the appropriate officials within the C.I.C. or I.R.R. chain-of-command provide authorization for OSI personnel, who have the proper security clearances, to examine the pertinent records.


