MEMORANDUM No. 9

24 January 1950

SUBJECT : Investigation Conducted by CIC Region XII

TO : 25.0 (Col PHIC?)

1. CIC Reg X is presently conducting an investigation which involves the following listed personalities some of whom are allegedly TIB members:

a. Dr. Rupan ^H RIDE, Augsburg, Landtag member and a political power in the Augsburg area. He also is the head of "Sozialer Helferring" Augsburg, which is a political-charitable organization. It is known by CIC that subject is definitely collecting information and probably connected with smuggling from Switzerland (dope?).

The organization reports that this man is unknown to them.

b. Dr. Theodor OBERLAENDER, Bad Kissingen is a special connection of this organization. Oberlaender is also a member of "Sozialer Helferring", and his daughter is employed in Dr. RINDT's office in Augsburg. A CIC cover has established that Mrs. Oberlaender frequently uses Dr. Rindt's telephone.

c. Joachim ^{ZA} JUNG (real name ROSEFIELD). Subject is presently on ice and is to be dropped within the next few months. He is now a member of org "G".

d. Victor Friedrich RISSA, Gruenwalderstrasse 48, formerly a member of the Bavarian Sonderministerium. Rissa is not a member of this organization, however works for former SS members; one of them by name of STEINER. This organization of former SS members is allegedly forming an intelligence net which they hope to have associated with the new German Government. CIC believes that they are being backed by one of the Western powers.

e. Achim ^{ZA} GSTER, secretary to Dr. Josef TUEHLER, head of CSU and son of General GSTER, former General Staff and Abwehr members.

f. Walter Fritz SEEFELDT, known to this organization. While Seefeld was in Spain, he wrote to Capt. Erikson TIB Frankfurt asking for aid. It is believed that he learned the cover name from BG secretary either in Munich or Starnberg. Seefeldt travels

extensively throughout Europe allegedly on his reputation of being a well-known international "Fussball"-player. He has many clippings and newspaper write-ups to prove his statements, however, a thorough check of all professional "Fussball"-players and newspapers fail to show that subject was known in Germany. Seefeld is allegedly born in Kiel on 1 Oct 1920.

g. Waldemar PABST, formerly a founder of German-American Legion and the Austrian-American Union. Was a power in the German Government prior to 1932. Subject claims to be forming an anti-communism party with headquarters in Switzerland. He has been residing in Switzerland since 1940.

h. Emil STECKER, Kempton, allegedly a Czech agent. From CIC mail cover it is known that Pabst is contacting both Stecker and Rindtby mail, and from contents of the letters it is apparent that Pabst is also in contact with all the above mentioned people.

2. It is believed that all the persons listed from a. thru f. are former members of an OSS net set up in 1945.

3. All previous attempts by CIC to gather more information about these people have failed. Seefeld has been their main source of information, and while they believe he is an out right liar his original lead did expose the connection between all these people. CIC would now like us to aid them in the following ways:

a. Furnish all background information we have re Seefeld.

b. Question Dr. Theodor Oberlander re Dr. Eugen Rindt to ascertain their connections and their activities.

c. Report whether Achim Oster is a member or connected to this organization.

d. Report all information we know re Pabst and Stecke and Misce.

4. Misce has agreed to double the organization he is working for and to turn in copies of all reports that he forwards plus a list of all people working for and with him. CIC Augsburg has agreed to furnish us with this list and also will show us the reports, if we are interested.
