(qv) head of military - technical advisory groups said to maintain close relations with  
SS members now in Egypt. Name given by J. L. LUBBINK.

German Counselor says VOSS' office will now be made up only AMEMB CAIRO 929; 9 x 53  
of Subj, who has been VOSS' assistant, and 4 Czechs from ex-Skoda.  
No one knows their function.

in Egypt.

One of earliest members of NSDAP, held party identity card under 20. Ceremonial  
chamberlain to Adolph Hitler until April 1945. Post 75 day, tried and given  
life sentence as war criminal. Released - for undisclosed reasons - 1951, six  
months prior to departure from Egypt.  
Secretary to VOSS; worked with him during recruitment about 80 Czech and German  
military, technical experts now in Egypt. Said to be influential with VOSS, other  
advisors, and to be violently anti-communist.  
Knew Hajj Amin al-HUSAYNI, ex-Grand Mufti, when latter was refugee in Germany,  
during the war. Has photo of Mufti, HITLER, himself of which he is very proud.  
Visited al-HUSAYNI numerous times in Cairo.  
Worked evenings at German Emb, Cairo, and he is said to be more influential  
with his government and Egyptian government than PASSELER. VOSS seeking dip status  
for self and subject.

Secretary to Wilhelm VOSS, subj has expressed personal deep disapproval of the recent declaration by Gamal ABD-al-NASR that guerilla warfare against the British in the Canal Zone might be resumed. Says German advisors will have nothing to do with guerillas fighting the British.

German advisors to NAZI government complain that Ambassador PAWELKE is inefficient and stupid; subj and VOSS, for whom he works are said to do most of the important work at the German Embassy, where subj particularly works in the evenings. VOSS is in Bonn, and one of the reasons for his trip is said to be to try to obtain dip status for subj and himself.

School fees for them are paid by the Egyptian Government. Monthly salary of subj is approximately LE 150.; owns private car.

Colonel TIEFENBACHER is adjutant to Special Advisor to the Minister of War (advisor is VOSS).

Central Planning Board of German Advisory Group employed by the  
Eg. Ministry of War & Marine shortly is to be abolished, and there  
is reason to believe that Germans no longer are to be employed as  
experts. Relations are cool between the Eg. liaison officer  
(unnamed by Source) and Subject, who is asst. to Wilhelm VOSS,  
Chief of the Planning Board. Subject has stated that it is not  
likely that contracts will be extended to more than 5 German  
officers. Thus, by April 1953, the services of the German  
Advisory Group in Egypt would be ended. (Source Comment: Reason  
for proposed limitation of employment of foreign experts is said  
to be lack of funds. However, several German experts believe that  
an agreement between British & Egyptians will be reached and that  
German advisers will be replaced by British experts.)
