CAB 2 has strong Estonian national tendencies and once stated that he "is and REMAINS" an Estonian. He realizes that his future is insecure in Germany (his work for us and his service with the Wehrmacht would make his life forfeit see below:
28. What instructions, if any, have been given to subject and/or accompanying individuals as to cover story, what to tell people, etc.? He is immigrating through normal channels.
29. What would be the consequences if subject and/or accompanying individuals were to fall into Russian hands. He feels that one more war (with Russia) is necessary and will occur, and he does not feel secure in his present location in Germany. (He has not been promised evacuation.) He has numerous friends (Estonian) in the U.S. and has heard good reports about life there. He would like to see what life in America is like and then decide as to whether he will remain. He would like to keep working with us as a contract basis (on a contract basis) once he gets to the U.S. He has not been given any offers along this line.

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29. Breakdown of estimated disposal cost . Depends on whether he goes through the new refugee program or through regular Consulate quota. Passage to the U.S., help once he gets there, etc will have to be determined along the way.
30. Who will bear (if we state "US Govt")? I don't know what the procedure is.
31. Does our responsibility end upon arrival of subject at destination? If not, explain . Depends on whether or not Home Office will want to assess him. I have made no promises along this line. I feel we owe it to him to see that he receives employment (he will be a graduate architect) in the event Home Office does not want to assess him.
