UJ-DROLLERY General

Ref: MOLA-10483 and EGQW-3931

The following cases have been dropped by Zipper for the reasons indicated:

1. UJ-DROLLERY #4: Failure on the part of the Soviet IS to establish contact with the DA since 1 July 1952. In any event, the DA was not properly amenable to control.

2. UJ-DROLLERY #5: Dropped because progress could not be made in establishing contact with the Soviet IS courier nor in identifying nor locating her contacts in western Germany. According to Zipper, the case was given over to the BfV. Actually there is no evidence that the BfV has done anything about it. MOB has taken up the contact as Case [ ]

3. UJ-DROLLERY #8: The principals were arrested by the British in April 1952, and the case was turned over to the BfV. Trial by German authorities is expected in the near future. Reports of interrogations by the British were either not furnished or were very meager. Likewise, Zipper states that it has obtained virtually no information from the BfV on this case.

4. UJ-DROLLERY #10: Dropped because of the arrest on 1 September 1952 of TONNE by eastern authorities and sentenced to four years imprisonment.

5. UJ-DROLLERY #12: Dropped because the principal turned out to be a fraud -- wanted on criminal charges by the German police. The extent of his contact with the Soviet IS in Turkey and the Near East, if any, is still unclarified. Zipper is attempting to have this cleared up by the LfV Bavaria, with which it has good working relations.

6. UJ-DROLLERY #103: The case ceased when the source apparently was arrested by eastern German authorities in January 1952.

7. UJ-DROLLERY #109: V-13099 was dropped because the pressure of other activities did not permit continuation of his work for Zipper. From the leads supplied by him, however, Zipper evolved to off-shoot cases which are still going: UJ-DROLLERY #109-A (TRAUUNG I) and UJ-DROLLERY #109-B (TRAUUNG II).

8. UJ-DROLLERY #110: Dropped to avoid crossing lines with the BfV.

9. UJ-DROLLERY #111: Dropped to avoid crossing lines with the BfV.

10. UJ-DROLLERY #375: Dropped because of difficulties in control of V-3090 and the transfer of "Alexander" from Munich. UJ-DROLLERY #378 was considered more promising.

11. UJ-DROLLERY #500: Dropped because of the seeming cessation of clandestine border-crossing activities on the part of the penetrated illegal border-crossing organization which followed the presumed arrest of V-2736, a companion Zipper penetration.

12. UJ-DROLLERY #501: Dropped when V-2736 disappeared in the DDR in April 1952; presumed arrested by eastern authorities.

13. UJ-DROLLERY #504: The remarks pertaining to UJ-DROLLERY #500 are applicable to this case.

14. UJ-DROLLERY# 505-B: Dropped as of 31 March 1953 because the source was not able to furnish leads for eastern operations.

15. UJ-DROLLERY #703: V-883.1's reports were considered useful for comparison with UJ-DROLLERY #704 which was considered to give better coverage of the target. In view of this and the generally low-level of the information obtained, the case, as a CI case, was dropped, and the source returned to positive intelligence work.

16. UJ-DROLLERY #704: V-2998, formerly V-2996/KNAPPE, disappeared in East Berlin in April 1952 and is presumed to have been arrested by eastern authorities.

17. UJ-DROLLERY #1004: Source, V-2997, ceased reporting as an outgrowth of the V-2996 flap.

18. UJ-DROLLERY #1200: V-3016/BLAU was dropped 29 February 1952 because it was impossible to convert him from an unwitting informant to a witting agent. Efforts to recruit him failed; nor was it possible to determine the identity of his sub-sources.

19. UJ-DROLLERY #1210: The case, as such, was dropped by GV G, and V-4190.4 was transferred from GV G to GV B and redesignated V-12858. GV B has now dropped the case as such, although it retains the possibility of affecting occasional contact.
