1. Reference reported that the Heidelberg Criminal Police had informed CIC that "ADLER" had been arrested and had claimed to be a CIC agent. CIC reportedly asked for traces in order to reply to the police who "have him in custody."

2. UPSWING contacted the Heidelberg police directly and determined that "ADLER" had been questioned on 6 March 1959 and recalled for questioning on 9 April 1959 on suspicion of assault and that he was cleared each time.

3. FYI: "Fall ADLER," one of the only twoplays of KATPOL radio agent operations - both of which were accomplished by UPSWING - was coordinated through MB/LB and ULS with G-2 USAREUR. His last radio message from the KATPOL was transmitted during the Hungarian revolt in the fall of 1956. Later, "ADLER," who had become somewhat of a psychopath during his years as a double agent, had purchased a rail ticket and ridden to the Hungarian border, <sup>considering</sup> his plan "to start a new life in Hungary and marry a wealthy woman there" (Reference B). UPSWING maintained loose contact with him in order to forestall any future decision to go back since going back would certainly entail his arrest and extraction from him of important information on UPSWING. Recently "ADLER" received a letter expressing an interest in reestablishing contact on the part of the HIS. According to UPSWING's chief of CE operations, UPSWING has made plans to have their "good Austrian friends" arrest "ADLER" and his HIS contact on the occasion of the first meeting in Austria if such a meeting ever takes place. UPSWING has promised to furnish further details on "ADLER's" arrest by the Heidelberg police as soon as they have a chance to interrogate him. He was supposed to meet in Munich with UPSWING's staff psychiatrist, @Dr. SCHIMMER, on 22 April 1959 but, for reasons yet unknown, he did not appear.
