3. Josef Adolf URBAN visited [redacted] on 13 November. He furnished some information (reported separately) on the Slavik group and asked [redacted] whether or not he could interest CIC in a new contact, an Austrian girl employed in an unknown capacity at the Hotel Imperial in Vienna. [redacted] told URBAN that he would have to have more specific information regarding the girl and her possibilities as well as the modus operandi agreed upon. At this point URBAN stated that he had met the girl only once so far and that he was unable to furnish the information requested. Further, repeated meetings with the girl would be necessary before he could provide the additional information and for this he would need time and money. [redacted] emphasized that without first having basic information he could not breach the subject to CIC. He will keep us posted on further developments.
