Synopsis of Developments

2. The following is a list of the principal developments which took place during this reporting period:

a. twice and received 12 rolls of undeveloped 35 mm film containing photographs of police reports. (This film has not yet been developed and printed, so a subject breakdown cannot yet be given.)

b. The Albert operation continues. He has contacted Peter ~~SARMIN~~ twice and it now appears as though Albert may be given for delivery to ~~SARMIN~~ a letter containing instructions setting up a meeting in the American Zone between ~~SARMIN~~ and an RIB principal agent. For further details, see paragraph 3, below.

c. Through the Albert operation, Juan LASIO was identified as an RIB recruitment target. He did not attend a meeting which was suggested in a letter sent to him by the RIB. For further details, see paragraph 4, below.

d. Developments in the Alois EDER operation were not of significance. He is still scheduled to be arrested by ZIPPER on his next trip to Germany.

e. Through Hideshne, the RIB is showing renewed interest in Eugenia ~~WENZSCH~~, who is employed in a sensitive position at MI/Idms. Action is being considered to forestall an RIB recruitment. For further details, see paragraph 5, below.

f. Two more persons have reported to that they have been approached by the RIB. Both have refused to become double agents and are moving from Urfahr to Idms. For further details, see paragraph 6, below.

g. Josef URBAN received yet another letter from the RIB attempting to get him to come to a meeting in Urfahr. Comment: The RIB tried

to recruit URBAN in July 1954. He immediately reported it to [] and moved from Urfahr to Lins. This is now the second letter that URBAN has received since moving to Lins.) Details will be reported separately as soon as the films have been developed.

b. [] is still trying to collect information on Georg KISLER, head of the Austro-Czech Society in Vienna. For further details, see paragraph 7, below.

i. Information has not yet been received on Czechs and Hungarians applying for visas to visit Upper Austria. For further details, see paragraph 8, below.

j. [] asked [] to pull together and photograph all his material on Alois GUEBERGER, Urfahr Police Director. He said that he would do so at the first opportunity.

k. [] was told to charge to his KUBARK expense account the entertainment costs involved in developing closer contacts, of possible operational value, with certain Upper Austrian officials. For further details, see paragraph 9, below.

l. The VCB Reports Office processed the following [] report: EAV-2135, Incident in Urfahr Involving Two USIA Illegal Traders.

Developments

3. The Albert operation continues, as Albert is reluctant to move from Urfahr to Lins. Upon instructions from the RIS, Albert has contacted Feder SAREIN several times. The position of SAREIN is unclear; in an apparent effort to cover himself against both sides, SAREIN has reported the contacts to the Vels police, while at the same time indicating to Albert that he may be willing to cooperate with the RIS but not to go over to Urfahr or return to the USSR. At his next meeting with the RIS, Albert is supposed to receive a letter for delivery to SAREIN which would set up a meeting, in the American Zone, between SAREIN and an unidentified person who is apparently an RIS principal agent. All of these developments will be reported separately as soon as the film containing the reports has been developed and printed. (For background information on the Albert case, see EASA-4259.

4. The RIS gave Albert a letter to be mailed in Lins to one IAN LASIC, born 10 October 1929 in Orahevica, Yugoslavia, residing Biselsberg¹⁰. From the contents of the letter, which was clandestinely opened by [] it is apparent that the RIS once had contact with LASIC and is trying

to resume this contact. Surveillance of the meeting site suggested in the letters indicated that LASTID did not attend the suggested meeting. This information will be reported separately as soon as the EIMS are developed and printed.

5. The Kluge case operation has come to LIFE again. The EIS is showing renewed interest in August KREMER, who is employed in a sensitive position at KL/Lima. It now appears that they will drop their efforts to get at KREMER through Kluge and will have a man try to strike up an acquaintance with KREMER in the streetcar on her way to work. Information received from DTG 63, whose cover job is in the same office with KREMER, indicates that KREMER's attachment to men and money may be sufficient to make her recruitable. Action to forestall a possible EIS recruitment is being considered. Details are being reported separately.

6. Two more persons, one a Polish man and the other an employee of the German Delegation in Lima, have come to [] with stories of attempted EIS recruitments. [] failed to play both of them as donkeys, but they both announced their intention to move immediately from Dr. Salto to Lima and their complete unwillingness to have anything to do with the EIS. [] did not recall the full names, but detailed reports are being written up. Details will be reported separately as soon as these reports have been received.

7. [] is still working on collecting information on Georg KUNIG, head of the Austro-Gesch Society in Vienna and a close friend of []. [] says that he will not contact KUNIG because such an operation would go far beyond his targets and his means, but [] believes [] may not be able to resist the temptation if the KUNIG lead really turns out to be a good one.

8. Regarding visa applications of Czech and Hungarian nationals visiting Upper Austria, [] reported that he receives check requests only on those persons visiting the rural areas of Upper Austria. Persons visiting Lima, fields or days are checked by the Police Divisions of those cities. Photographs of visa check requests have not yet been received by [] because [] has allegedly not yet had time to have the file re-organized in a manner to make photographing on a continuous basis feasible.

9. While living in fields, [] was effectively out of Evon Lima social life and contacts. How that he has moved to Lima, the possibility arises for him to develop various social contacts which could be of possible operational value. Among such potential contacts are (Upper Police Director) Alois JAGHNER, (SP-6a Law Inspector) Kurt HILGER, head of the city housing office, and the directors of the Upper Austrian Krambambusch, Gornitz, Post, Finance, and Gas and Electric works. The various possibilities here have frequently been discussed between [] in the course of a

discussion of the high costs involved in the social development of such contacts, [] told [] to charge these costs to his KUBARK expense fund, under the heading of "representation."

Assessment of Developments

10. As can be noted from the above, most of the developments during this period were connected with the monitoring of RIS activities in the Lins area. The increase in [] activity in this sphere during the past year is remarkable. Whether this indicates an increase in RIS activity, or simply an increase in the propensity of Austrians to report such activity to Austrian police authorities, is not known. In any case, [] reporting will soon be sufficient to give a fairly satisfactory picture of the type activities engaged in by RIS Verkehr.

Future Plans

11. During the coming month, [] plans to pay particularly close attention to the following matters:

a. Follow closely the Albert case, and try to pick up any leads which it might offer. For example, if SARHIN is in fact contacted by an RIS principal agent, GRALBA will try to identify him through surveillance but will be unable to take any positive action against him. He expressed his willingness to turn over to KUBARK any such lead.

b. Make certain that a procedure does get set up whereby [] gets copies of visa check requests on Czechs and Hungarians intending to visit Upper Austria.
