<p>1. Upon receipt of Reference B, we brought to UPSWING's attention the fact that they had agreed to drop interest in the Subject of BRLN 3249 (hereafter referred to as Subject). The undersigned was then shown a copy of a letter dated 18 June 1959 from the UPSWING Operational Security section to the UPSWING office which had been interested in Subject, and this letter pointed out that KUBARK had traced Subject before that office had expressed an interest in him and requested that they drop their interest in him.</p> <p>2. While UPSWING was pulling together information and tracing (fmu) KROLL and the other individuals mentioned in Reference B, the undersigned had the opportunity to review the UPSWING file on Subject. The following additional information to that reported in MUNI 4853, dated 12 June 1959 is forwarded for your files:</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;"><i>Novi Sad</i></p> <p>a. Character assessment: Subject was considered an Anglophile before the war, and an opponent of Communism. He comes from a wealthy family. From 1942 to 1945 he was with the Abwehr in Neusatz (apparently a city in Yugoslavia). At that time he knew Dr. (fmu) KOHL (sic) and (fmu) ROSLER. After the end of the war he was sentenced to two years in jail. As a hemp specialist, he was released before the end of the sentence and given a position with the Government in the Forest and Agriculture office in Neusatz. He subsequently was transferred to the Agriculture Ministry in Belgrade.</p> <p>b. March 1959: He has traveled to Italy, Austria, West Germany and East Berlin. He inquired about the possibilities of obtaining asylum in Austria or West Germany since he feared that he would be arrested upon his return to Belgrade. He stated that if he didn't get a letter from his wife allaying his fears, he would remain in the West.</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;"><i>Karl Schmid</i></p> <p>3. UPSWING had cards on over 200 KROLL's, but none were affiliated with UPSWING. UPSWING had no traces on (fmu) SMECHALA, (fmu) SMIKALA or (fmu) SMEJKAL. UPSWING had considerable information on <u>Walter ROSLER</u>, born 11 January 1901 in Kronstadt residing in Trieste, and in July 1958 he and <u>Josef DEAN</u> (born 8 January 1897 in Zatec) who was formerly active with UPSWING in Austria as V- 13690, but who was dropped because of his associations with other Western intelligence agencies) <del>was</del> visited V 14 410, and attempted to recruit him for a job as interrogator at Camp PIDING. UPSWING apparently suspected LfV Bavaria since their file shows a letter to the LfV asking if ROSLER was associated with them. There was no indication that the LfV ever replied.</p> <p>4. Munich telephone books and address books contain no record of ROSLER.</p> <p>5. In view of the foregoing, it appears that the LfV Bavaria and BfV (possibly working together) might be the agencies interested in Subject. It does not appear that UPSWING is involved, but we would appreciate receiving any additional data on (fmu) KROLL or SMIKALA (?) which could be checked out with UPSWING.</p> <p>NOTE: The above was prepared before receipt of BRLN 5872 and is being forwarded as a record of action taken with UPSWING concerning the case.</p>
