Miscellaneous Foreign Elements in Colombia
Ferenc VAJTA

1. Subject has succeeded in obtaining documentation to remain in Colombia. He is now attempting to get a job with some American company. His only apparent qualifications are that he is an active worker and speaks six languages. He will continue teaching school until he finds other work which pays more.
2. VAJTA has not given up his plans to attempt to get into the U. S. He was told by the American Consul in Bogotá that apart from his previous difficulties and deportation from the U.S., he would not now be eligible for a visa because he does not have a valid passport. It is VAJTA'S plan to obtain a passport from the Dean of the Diplomatic Corps which he believes would be valid to travel to the U.S. as a visitor.
3. VAJTA claims an intense desire to aid the U.S. in the struggle in Korea or in any other part of the world where he could be useful.
4. Hqs. will be kept informed of any further pertinent developments in the VAJTA case.
