Cambio leaves for the Erzgebirge on 22 April and will return on 11 May. He has already commissioned the inception of surveillance of trains in Joann-Goerogenstadt and on his return will have a month's coverage which can be assessed in west. His main job is to concentrate on the Transport Abteilungen or Battallions which ship the ore by truck to Siegnar-Schönau. From Chemnitz he is going to see how far he can trace the truck columns toward the Polish border. He is also going to try to renew some acquaintances at Objekte where the chemical washing (Aufbereitung) is done. He has some other things on his mind but I told him to concentrate on transportation and getting exact figures from known sub sources rather than trying to cover the field. He understands that this is a test run and is naturally anxious to carry it out well.

By the way, last year he was on his way to Berlin with a Russian Geiger counter and a so called Flektroscope when he had to ditch the stuff, packed in a ~~case~~ case, in Jüterborg during a Kontrolle. Have we any interest in either of these items?

Gave in the false DPA which pleased him. Also 200 ostmarks for travel expenses and 100 West for keeping his family together while he is gone. Since he always stays with buddies when traveling, not only are his expenses low but he runs far few risks of being picked up. The railroad figures are going to be transcribed on a piece of cloth and sewed which he will have sewed by a tailor friend into his mining cap. It occurs to me that the rustle proof paper might have been more efficient. Have we any?
