MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Meeting on Raoul Wallenberg on 4 April 1983

1. I joined [] and [] in a meeting with Dennis C. Blair of NSC to brief him on our holdings on the Wallenberg case.

2. The meeting was initiated by Mr. Blair who had met with Sonia Sonnenfeld, a Swedish national and a relative of Wallenberg, who had applied to Mr. Blair for support from the USG to locate Wallenberg. Mr. Blair clearly was interested only in collecting enough information from us to satisfy Mrs. Sonnenfeld.

3. Mr. Blair was given a general briefing on the extent of the information in our files highlighting the following points:

a. We have no unique information resulting from CIA activities in regard to Wallenberg.

b. The sensitivity of our information rests only on the fact that much of what we have in our files is from the Swedish Government. By law we are required to keep the source of that information classified, however, we are certain from the fact that the Swedish Government had made available to Mrs. Sonnenfeld some 13,500 pages of documents that all the information we hold was revealed to her.

3. After approximately 20 minutes, Mr. Blair said that he was satisfied with the information that he had received from us and he felt that he need only tell Mrs. Sonnenfeld that the USG had no information relating to the whereabouts of Mr. Wallenberg. From his discussion of this case with us, Mr. Blair made it clear that this case had come up before and that his predecessor had already warned him that Mrs. Sonnenfeld again would appear on the scene some day.
