PERTINENT INFORMATION				
<p>.....Baron APOR only recently established contact with General Andrea ZAKO, chief of the MEBK (Magyar Hadviseltek Rajtarsi Kozossege), who resides in Innsbruck. The contact was made, it seems, following the urging of Eckhardt TIPOR, Minister of National Defense of the Hungarian Government in Exile in New York, through which General ZAKO and his organization (MEBK) reportedly work. The MEBK was formed by anti-Communist former officers and enlisted men of the dissolved Hungarian Army. MEBK has as its dependence, among other things, an intelligence service and clandestine groups located in Hungary. It seems that General ZAKO recently traveled to Paris, according to information learned in circles close to APOR, and met with SHAPE officials.</p> <p>On 26 June 1952, on the occasion of the Hungarian Armed Forces holiday (St. Ladislao's Day), General ZAKO is reportedly to give a lecture of a military nature from the Hungarian Section of Radio Italiana (RAI), whereas the political questions will be discussed by Professor Ladislao TOTH, formerly official professor of the Hungarian language at the University of Rome and the University of Naples and a person of undoubted anti-Communist belief. In the event that General ZAKO does not obtain an Italian entry visa in time, his speech will reportedly be recorded in Austria and later transmitted from Rome on short wave. Indications are, however, that the Presidency of the Council has given its consent. ZAKO would like to take this opportunity to realize a long-standing desire: To enter into direct contact with Italian military authorities and to develop, if possible, a project of collaboration in the intelligence field. It is noted that APOR received by General EFisio MARRAS, Italian Chief of Staff for Defense, on 10 June 1952.</p>
