Please see my letter No. 171 of 24 April 1953 and other letters relating to General ZAKO's activities in the Hungarian emigration.

My French S.D.E.C.E. contact told me yesterday that General Zako had visited London early in June where (1) he saw General ANDERS, the Polish military leader, about his participation in the meeting of emigre military personalities to be held in Paris in September and (2) he apparently contacted the British.

The Colonel went on to state that Zako is receiving some kind of British aid in his activities at Munich. He added that his services had photographs showing the arrival of British materials and supplies at General Zako's printing and publishing enterprise. He intimated that this aid was being rendered through the British Information Service at Munich.
