

- April '40 Worked with LORENZ who had been lent to Amt VI by RIBBENTROP, in the office of VIF., (the department for Sweden, France, Belgium and Holland). It was LORENZ's duty to advise ZSCHUNKE, who was very young and by no means conversant with foreign affairs, and to prevent his being misinformed. (On one or two occasions ZSCHUNKE had supplied inaccurate information to HEYDRICH, at that time chief of the R.S.H.A.) LORENZ

- 1941 Personal informant to the German authorities in FRANCE, with the rank of SS Obersturmfuehrer. Was succeeded by BERNAHRD. LORENZ
- Jan/Feb '42. Known to LORPHEVRE, agent of Abt VI, Brussels from whom he borrowed Belgian money. ZSCHUNKE was said to be abysmally ignorant of economic affairs and industrial conditions with which he was officially concerned. Spent enormously and must have lived far above his means. LORPHEVRE

- March '42 Met GRIBAR at the Hotel BRISTOL, Brussels, and recruited her to work for the S.D. Dispensed with her services in mid-December. GRIBAR

- Nov. '42 Employed SWEERTS as agent to obtain information on various officers, including Capt. WARNEZ and ROUSEE. Arranged for SWEERTS to attend S.D. School in BERLIN. Before May '40 had a mission in FRANCE and then in SPAIN. After the armistice he worked with KNOCHE in PARIS. After a scandal in MARSEILLE he was recalled to BERLIN and then sent to BRUSSELS. SWEERTS

- Sept. '42 Known to MAUJOCKS as Head of Abt. VI, Brussels. MAUJOCKS  
P.F. 600,485
- 1943. Known to LORPHEVRE, agent of Abt VI, Brussels. Served in Russia. Before the war a member a German Police Mission attached to the Italian police for the surveillance of foreigners at the time of the visit of HITLER and MUSSOLINI in ITALY. Has a Dutch identity card. LORPHEVRE  
PF. 600,663
- 1943. SWEERTS in convinced that ZSCHUNKE has a Swiss passport through the German Foreign Office. Formerly on the Staff of the B.d.S, PARIS. Frh. von BOELLING was ZSCHUNKE's secretary. SWEERTS.
- 1943. Possessed a Swiss passport in the name of ZELLER. Was the creator of Abt. VI Zieme Bureau (Brussels) which was made up of agents regularly taken on by Abt.VI and who were used for special missions which were never specified. ZELLER or HELLER was for a time ZSCHUNKE's representative. GARRITT  
PF. 600275
- March '43 GARRITT left Gratz for BRUSSELS and reported to the SD where he met ZSCHUNKE who witnessed his signature on his entry into the SD and gave him general information on espionage. Approved of a plan formulated by GARRITT to create permanent Intelligence Centres in Portugal and Spain to function with the Belgian Colony. GARRITT
- April '43 Head of Dept L VI of Abt.VI Brussels. GARRITT.
- Nov. 43 Introduced to Rene DELHAYE, captured German agent, by COLLET (SD agent in Brussels - now captured). Witnessed the signature of DELHAYE to declaration saying he would not divulge any information which might come to his knowledge during his services with the Germans. DELHAYE

his service was "military" and SCHUNKE's was "political"  
So Georges joined EIRENFELS' service.
