Dear Al,

during the last two months I wrote you about six long letters but later made up my mind, did not mail them. I threw them away. I do not want to bother anybody with my personal affairs and you were already extremely helpful by giving me the affidavit. I know what does that mean.

Since I used to be always duty conscious, I am sorry that for the last two-three months your mission did not have much profit of my work. But I think, important is that the work was done and I hope fairly well.

You may understand that though I am not urging the solution of my problem, once I would like to discuss thoroughly with you the whole matter. I have something on my mind which would settle the problem. Please give me possibility to explain with you or with Bob; but more than ten minutes. If you wish I go even to Vienna, but I confess not very willingly. If there is no other solution I am coming. It is better to clarify things. You must understand that I am not urging, but it is very hard to live with such a tension on my mind.

I just received a letter from Howard Chapin and a statement was made about it. This is again a wonderful more than sufficient sign of your candor, your will and straightforwardness. But technically is something wrong. I hope we can make clear picture and tabula rasa if we discuss this problem.
