- APPRECIATE REF DETAILED INTERROGATION PLAN FOR NASHIRI. HOWEVER, WE HAVE SERIOUS RESERVATIONS WITH THE CONTINUED USE OF ENHANCED TECHNIQUES WITH NASHIRI (SUBJECT) AND ITS LONG TERM IMPACT ON HIM.
