## MEMO FOR RECORD

Based on the attached paraphrase of cable received on 2-3 September, I arranged a conference with <u>General Connolly</u>, Office of the Foreign Liquidation Commission, at 1530 hours this date in General Connolly's office. I permitted General Connolly and Mr. S. D. Boykin, Chief of the Compliance Branch, OFLC, to read the paraphrased cable and made the following points:

1. That the source of the message was <u>fairly</u> reliable but that there was not sufficient evidence that the Colonel Rogers in question <u>had</u> made the reported statements to consider them positive.

2. That our (CIG) reaction to the message was as follows:

<u>a.</u> If the individual in question was engaging in any foreign clandestine intelligence operations, as an official of OFLC, he was violating proper governmental practices.

<u>b.</u> If he was discussing a possible connection between OFLC and any sub-rosa political group he would be jeopardizing the status of the OFLC.

3. That our interest in the matter was strictly to report a possible condition which, if true, might operate against the interests of the charter of OFLC.

At the request of General Connolly, I agreed to provide them with anything further in this connection which might come to our attention.
