ABSTRACT

These letters concern the history of the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) written by the SSU History Staff. Rear Admiral Hillenkoetter sent the volumes to General Donovan for his inspection. After reviewing the volumes of the history, Gen. Donovan was instructed to send them to the Joint Security Control* (JSC) for distribution to government agencies which might benefit from the experiences and lessons learned by OSS.

Subject: Coordination of Intelligence Collection

Reference: (a)HIA Directive No. ? (b)CIG Directive No. 16 (c)CIG Directive No. 18

1. It will be recalled that GIG Directive No. 16, as approved by the Director of Central Intelligence and the Intelligence Advisory Board, was issued as of Hovember 1, 1946 to provide a plan for the coordination of biographic intelligence.

2. NIA Directive No. 7 was likewise issued on January 21, 19h7 to provide a plan for the coordination of collection activities. CIG Dircotive No. 18 was issued under date of January 23, 19h7 as an implementation of NIA Directive No. 7.

3. The Director of Central Intelligence and pertiment sections of GIO have followed with interest the implementation of these programs. CIO representatives have visited nearby diplomatic establighments to determine the adequacy of the field implementation of the basic directives and their supporting departmental directives.

4. As a result of these visits, the following general conclusions were drawns

a. The announcement of overall palicies and objectives in the NIA and CIO directives were of so abstract a nature that the departmental directives issued in implementation of them failed to outline detailed field instructions for standard collection procedures.

b. Although surrently effective departmental and agency directives to their field collectors, issued prior to the CIG announcement of overall policies and objectives, were not in direct conflict to MEA Directive No. 7 and CIG Directive No. 18, they have not in all cases been in complete consonance therewith.

c. There are specific instances where agencies in Washington ILLEGIB have required their intelligence collectors to report upon subject matter which is not within their allocations, such as

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d. Several embassies have not yet established the biographical file and have not been using the standard approved form, as required by GIG Directive No. 16 (The Coordination of Miographical Intelligence Collection), which was agreed upon by the Intelligence Advisory Spard.

5. Consular of ficers in some areas are not fully integrated into the coordination program.

5. It is believed that after IAB No. 1 (The Coordination of the Production of Intelligence) has been finally approved and specific allocations of dominant interest have been made, implementation of the sellection directives will become facilitated.

6. It is therefore requested that:

a. After the coordination of intelligence production has been initiated, each of the IAN agencies revise departmental directives based on the overall plan for the coordination of collection activities to provide more detailed field instructions;

b. Thereafter the collection chiefs of the agencies neet together with a CIO representative to present their drafts for uiscussion in order to assure the necessary integration and completeness before transmission to the field;

<u>c</u>. Incident to this revision of current departmental directives in coordination of intelligence production, currently effective collection directives which are not in complete harmony with the overall coordination of collection program be either rescinded or revised in order to eliminate the chance of confusion and misunderstanding on the part of collectors in the field.
