DIRECTOR:

The Director is attending a USCIB meeting this afternoon. It is hoped that a new charter will be prepared on USCIB some time in the near future.

General Wright will attend a SANAC meeting this afternoon to discuss psychological warfare. As previously mentioned, there is a great deal of interest in this project but there is still no decision as to who will be responsible for the activity.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR:

There has been a tremendous increase in the number of papers clearing through the Director's office recently -- it has been observed that many papers are hand-processed and fail to be recorded in the Executive Registry. Much time is wasted in locating papers and keeping control of them. When it is necessary to hand-carry a paper, in the Executive Registry should be notified of its routing to keep the records straight.

There is still a considerable amount of by-passing being done -- the Deputy must be informed of decisions made by the Director.

There appears to be a lack of coordination among the staff. Frequently, papers are brought in for decision prior to ironing out minor differences between interested staff members. Again, this is a time-consuming factor, which, in addition to the increase in the number of papers and visitors received in the Director's office, places an unnecessary burden in that office.

TCAPS:

Mr. Childs explained the new numbering system for NSC Directives. Initially, based on our recommendations, NSC will issue some half-dozen "National Security Council Intelligence Directives." Subsequently, there should be published only one or two additional directives a year. CIA will implement the above by issuing "DCI Directives" (which correspond to the old CIG Directives). The NSC will not pass upon the DCI Directives. The first group of "DCI Directives" will include data from both the former CIG Directives and the new NSC Intelligence Directives. Distribution will be made to members of IAC only, with copy to NSC for their information. There will be no IAC numbered directives.

OCD:

Captain Olsen stated that Dr. Fine, AEC, had been in to see them reference contacts for flow of material between AEC and CIA.

The flow of business this past month has greatly increased due primarily to increased ORE requirements. Liaison people are expressing a little feeling with regard to the increasing demands we are making on them.

00:

Mr. White, FBIB, has indicated that the people under consideration for dismissal who were taken back are having difficulty in becoming re-adjusted. Offered the suggestion that proposed dismissals be suspended immediately prior to their being called to appear before the Board rather than several weeks, as we have done.

This practice has resulted in other employees presuming the reason for the suspension and consequently has caused embarrassment to the individual returning to duty. (Colonel Shannon here stated that in future suspension notices will be handed out just prior to the individual's being called before the board.)

ORE:

Captain McCollum has just returned from the South where he addressed several groups of Naval Reserves -- most of whom have had combat experience -- on our mission. All expressed a great interest in our work.





At the suggestion of Captain Ford, the Director agreed to changing the time of the Weekly Staff Meeting from 0900 to 0930. (Col Shannon to issue memo notifying all concerned.)

Most of the controversies with reference to the NSC Directives were cleared up as a result of meeting of IAC members on December 10, Very few non-concurrences remain. It is proposed to present these NSC directives at the National Security Council meeting on Friday, December 12, 1947.

Capt Ford then recommended that prior to arrival of speaker, the group assembled be briefed on refraining from raising controversial questions.

OCD:

Since the change in our working hours, it has been found that the char women come into the offices before employees have had a chance to complete their security check. It would be helpful if the cleaning people could delay starting their work 15 minutes or so. (Col Edwards has already taken up this matter with PBA.)

Captain Olsen stated that they had received complaints to the effect that it took too long to obtain material through their channels -- GCD has the machinery to do the work and get it done quicker than anybody. Merely tell OCD when the material is wanted and everything will be done to meet the deadline. If no rush is indicated it will go through regular routine. Capt Olsen would appreciate it if Office Chiefs would see that requests flow through regular channels.







DIRECTOR:

We have now prepared enabling legislation which is presently in the hands of the Committee on Armed Services. Both Senate and House Committees have indicated favorable and prompt action. This implementing legislation provides for our overseas operations and imposes certain restrictions on the part of the General Accounting Office with regard to our operating statistics. We do not foresee any difficulty in the passage of this act.

Mr. Forrestal has returned from his conference with the Joint Chiefs. We have no information on the outcome yet.

In reply to OCD's inquiry, the Director stated we had no definite information as to when the NSC inspectors were coming to CIA.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR:

By Security Council Directive, we are required to provide data for the State Department's new Public Information Program. This is not a committee group but rather a staff group. We will have to provide a man at the P-5 level for this group. He should be a man who has had some psychological warfare experience, as well as a good intelligence man. We want to furnish a No. 1 man for this full-time job. Assistant Directors are to furnish prospective candidates for this job. The Director will make selection from this list.

On three occasions last week, the Deputy Director had to spend considerable time talking to job applicants who had been referred to him by people in our organization. This is a waste of time — the place to send them is the Personnel Branch.

It has come to the point where some telephone conversations within CIA have almost completely disregarded security. There was one case last week where contents of a JIC paper were discussed with our own security office. We must never forget that our phones are susceptible to interpret believe this is ception.
