Dear Doreen:

The enclosed letter explains Robert Broome's difficulties. He has been paid only through January. I am trying to get him back to Washington in time for him to complete only this month's salary. He will arrive in Washington approximately 6:00 P.M. Friday, February 28, and under the terms of our contract as I interpret it he is only entitled to this month's pay.

Dick Rossi took all of the boxes which I was carrying for General Chennault along with the list for customs declarations. I am returning the check for \$50.00 which you gave me originally because Dick is carrying plenty of money and can settle with the General along with his other expenses. Some time ago I sent the General's aspirin and soda.

This is a great day in the history of this operation. We finally got four ships loaded away and I am sure everyone feels better although we all had to work constantly for over a 26-hour period. Everyone deserves a great deal of credit for this. There is no question but what Wheate is a very unusual asset to us. He has done a splendid job.

I have not heard from Maya since her arrival in Washington and I assume that she is doing everything to get her papers in order. I think that with your help she should be ready to come out here within another week. If it is necessary, I shall send you a cable requesting her ticket via air directly here and make reservations, etc. for her and will send you a bank draft for the amount due. This will save atleast a week.
