Director's Meeting

Tuesday, 12 June 1951

The Director said that he believed I & S put in too much time on inconsequential investigations.

The Director commented on the  Project and said that if G-2 was doing it we should let them spearhead it but should not try and take it over ourself.

The Director commented on the report on the Watch Committee and inquired as to whether it should be raised at an IAC meeting. He was briefed on the problems of the Watch Committee.

Mr. Dulles reported that General McClure was seeing Gen. Wyman today and that he would arrange for him to see Mr. Wolf when the latter returns.

Mr. Jackson reported that Dr. Pratt of the New York hospital will come to investigate the medical office this week.

Mr. Jackson reported that the NSC sub-committee would meet on the magnitude paper this afternoon. Mr. Dulles said that he would attend but it was agreed that the Director should not attend until a later meeting.

Mr. Dulles reported that Mr. Harriman's office had called to inquire when OSS received notice of Japanese peace negotiations in August 1945.
