[redacted] noted that [redacted] had made a number of observations as a result of his recent European trip, and that he was preparing a written report. He also noted that Mr. Douglass was somewhat reluctant to have [redacted] report on administrative matters and should confine his remarks to the intelligence field. It was the concensus of those present that [redacted] should prepare a full report which would be shown to the D/DCI after which the report would be circulated to the interested offices.

Mr. Reber briefly discussed the IAC meeting held on 19 July and circulated to those present a memorandum regarding CIA debriefing activities for comment, prior to its submission to the AD's at their next meeting.

[redacted] stated that in connection with future AD meetings, he had discussed with Mr. Jackson the idea of both the DCI and the D/DCI discussing matters which they felt should be brought to the attention of the AD's, rather than depending on the AD's to bring up subjects for discussion.

Mr. Becker noted that he was looking over the NSC 10 Series in an effort to determine where we stood today. In this connection, it was noted that Timm of [redacted] was drafting a limitation agreement which would attempt to define the areas of responsibility of [redacted] and [redacted]

[redacted] noted that the first course of the CIA Intelligence School begins today and will run for a period of twelve weeks.
