Director's Meeting

Tuesday, 14 August 1951

Mr. Jackson brought up the question of the letter to the FBI
in regard to the [redacted] The DCI signed it. HR70-14

Mr. Jackson mentioned the request from Mr. Jacobus of NSRB for papers on the study of the net capabilities of the USSR to attack the U. S. Mr. Jacobus wished to receive the flow of papers as they are completed. The DCI disapproved this.

Mr. Dulles mentioned a cable received from our man [redacted] who apparently needs more backing for coordination. The DCI stated that the ambassador is the only one who can give him authority for coordination of intelligence.

Mr. Dulles came to the following conclusions during his trip:

the Director's signature. Colonel Hanson will handle this in coordination with [redacted]

e. More control should be exercised over instructions going out to the field from OPC

f. [redacted]

g. More CIA intelligence should go to SHAPE. [redacted] will follow.

Mr. Dulles stated that we should reassess certain operations. He sighted [redacted] Although there is a possible need for employing [redacted] personnel in this country, he sees no need for [redacted] Mr. Dulles will check.
