SUBJECT: Comments on Draft DCID 3/4, "Production of Owidad Missile and Astronautics Intelligence" (Prepared by GMIC, 31 December 1958)

1. The discussion which follows centers around the meaning and implication of paragraph 4.c. on page 5 of subject document which reads in part:

Specific responsibilities of the CMAIC shall include the following:

c. To produce (1) coordinated drafts of mational intelligence estimates, ...

2. Since the wording of this puragraph has been changed from what appears in the current CMIC charter ("Proparing coordinated contributions for...") and since the wording is consistent with that of the JARIC charter, it is assumed that the procedure which is proposed for CMEC is to be the same as that of JARIC. This would imply that CMEC would draft and coordinate the estimate to be presented to the USIE for its approval. The usual MIE protecture of contributions to OME, DME Staff draft, and coordination of the MIE by the Board and the usual USIE representatives for MIE's would be circummented. The protecture would allow a very limited amount of time for a very general review of the CMEC draft by the Board of Mational Estimates, which could then recommend changes (presentably to CMEC and the DCI).

3. The arguments presented in the attached OHE memoranium to the Director (perticularly, paragraphs 3 and 4) are basic to the decision which he must make; it is recommended that this Office indorse OHE's recommendations in subparagraphs 6. b. and c. end support AD/ME in this matter to the fullest extent.

4. Is addition to the general arguments presented in the AD/ME's memoranhas, the Hodocmic Research Area has serious reservations as to GHE's equility to evaluate our contations that is the bread scenamic cost and feasibility considerations which have been and should be an important part of HHE's on the over-all equilities of the Sime-Seviet Hloc in the field of guided missiles and space activities. These reservations center around the fast that GHEC does not now have nor is it likely to have, the capability to evaluate our contributions to such estimates. Although our contributions are good and have significantly improved the over-all quality of these estimates, we feel that they deserve the type of dots led review and constructive efficies which only the Staff and Board have been able to give to this subject which so greatly influences US foreign and demestic policy. The proposed DCHD would not pureit this.

5. Furthermore, if certain alternative paragraphs in other parts of the subject paper are approved, CMIC would be barred from writing the over-all type of estimate which is required for maticual policy decisions. Specifically, if paragraph 3. b. (1), page 3, as reconmended by the military services is approved, CMIC would not have a substantive responsibility for momental requirements or deployment and would be limited to writing an estimate covering only scientific, technical and production aspects of the problem. The CIA recommendation for this paragraph would give CMEC the broadness of coverage necessary for an over-all estimate.

6. Another elternative procedure might most next of the objections to the excess procedure and that proposed in the subject BCHD. The stops involved in this procedure are consideration. This compared with the other two currently under consideration. This alternative differs from the DCHD procedure in that the estimate is drafted by the dHE dual frather than by CHCC and is coordinated by the Board of Maticual Brinnics together with the CHCC representatives. An additional Brinnings would be that CHCC would have more time to carry out its other functions which could improve the intelligence on which the estimate depends.

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
