



PREFACE




FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF SELECTED STORAGE INSTALLATIONS, BOBRUYSK.




FIGURE 3. SELECTED STORAGE INSTALLATIONS, BOBRUYSK. Sketch compiled from June 1963.
