


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PREFACE

This report is one in a series on Soviet Ground Force and Logistic installations being prepared for a DIA/CIA Panel. The series is being coordinated, published and disseminated by NPIC. The photographic analysis is being performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group, the CIA Photographic Intelligence Division (NPIC), and the Production Center 1P1a (DIA). The photographic analysis for this particular report was performed by the NPIC Photographic Analysis Group.

In the interest of uniformity, the titles and letter designators for the facilities observed at these installations are identical with those appearing in the project requirement. When a specific facility is not observed both its title and letter designator are omitted in the report.

Titles and letter designators for the various facilities are as follows: (A) railroad service, (B) road service, (C) landing strips, (D) administrative and troop housing areas, (E) storage areas, (F) ammunition storage areas, (G) POL storage areas, (H) other buildings and facilities, (J) equipment storage/maintenance areas, (K) athletic fields, (L) small—arms firing ranges, (M) driver training areas, (N) tank/assault gun firing ranges, (P) flat trajectory firing ranges, (Q) artillery emplacements (batteries), (R) infantry or combined arms field training area or courses, (S) special training facilities, (T) unidentified facilities or tracking activity.

FIGURE 1. LOCATION OF KOVROV AMMUNITION DEPOT SOUTH.




FIGURE 2. KOVROV AMMUNITION DEPOT SOUTH, KOVROV, USSR, JUNE 1964.

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SUMMARY

Kovrov Ammunition Depot South is located 25 kilometers (km) south of Kovrov and 3 km south-southwest of Ivanovo (Figure 1).

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


FIGURE 3. KOVROV AMMUNITION DEPOT SOUTH. Sketch compiled from

The installation covers approximately 600 acres and consists of a double-secured ammunition storage area and an adjacent support area. The storage area contains 39 ammunition storage buildings, 11 probable ammunition storage buildings, 1 probable bunker, 1 probable munitions loading building, and 2 support build-

ings. The support area contains 2 barracks/administration buildings, 13 quarters, 2 probable storage buildings, 6 support buildings, an athletic field, and a probable small-arms firing range (Figures 2 and 3).

The area is covered on 12 KEYHOLE missions between December 1961 and December 1964. Comparative analysis reveals no change in facilities and light activity throughout the period.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION

Railroad Service

The installation is served by a siding from the Kovrov-Murom rail line.

Road Service

A secondary road connects the installation to Ivanovo and Kovrov.

Administration and Troop Housing Area

Area D contains 1 E-shaped barracks/administration building, 1 U-shaped barracks/administration building, 13 quarters, 2 probable storage buildings, and 6 support buildings.

Ammunition Storage Area

Area F contains 39 ammunition storage buildings, 1 probable bunker, 11 probable ammunition storage buildings, 1 probable munitions loading building, and 2 support buildings.

Athletic Field

Area K is an athletic field.

Small-Arms Firing Range

Area L is a probable small-arms firing range, $320\ \text{by}\ 210\ \text{feet}$.
