3. The Syrian front appears to have been the quietest today since the war began. There was little activity either on the ground or in the air. A highlevel Israeli military officer reports that Damascus is using the lull to re-equip two of its armored divisions with new tanks delivered by the Soviets to the Syrian ports of Latakia and Tartus.

4. <u>Cairo and Tel Aviv continue to report extremely</u> heavy fighting in the Sinai, but neither is providing many details. Israel claims to have destroyed 110 tanks and 20 aircraft today.


5. An Israeli military spokesman has reported that the Israeli task force on the west bank was substantially reinforced during the night. He claimed that as of midafternoon today Israel had about 150 tanks as well as artillery on the west bank and that the task force had overrun Egyptian artillery units and captured some bridging equipment.

According to the Israeli, the Egyptians are assembling a force of four brigades from the west bank and the Cairo area to attack the Israeli force. Cairo also is reportedly planning to launch a large air attack on the force and the ponton bridge placed by the Israelis across the canal. The Israeli spokesman said the Egyptians have severed some of their own bridges to prevent their use by Israeli forces.

Tel Aviv has not characterized the canal crossing as the beginning of a major offensive, but has been quick to exploit the success of the small initial force. Tel Aviv, however, is not likely to sucrifice the task force to heavy Egyptian attack and may withdraw it and subsequently launch another such assault elsewhere on the canal. 25X1 Egypt is drafting additional manpower, accord-9. ing to an Iraqi news service. The service guotes an announcement published in Cairo today calling all 19year-olds to military service. The normal conscription age is 20. ## SOVIET NAVAL ACTIVITY IN THE MEDITERRANEAN


17. No Soviet cargo ships have gone through the Bosporus southbound today, and no additional cargo ships are expected to enter Syrian or Egyptian ports within the next 12 hours. Two Soviet cargo ships are still in Latakia and seven--including a tanker--are in Alexandria.

18. The positions of Soviet combatants remain essentially unchanged. Two medium landing ships that have been cast of Cyprus have apparently left to return to the Elack Sea. An LST and the three medium landing ships that went through the Bosporus yesterday are northeast of Crete, probably heading for the northeast Cyprus area. Two additional LSTs are due to Yeave the eastern Méditerranean within the next couple of days.


19. Three Soviet ships continue to trail the USS Independence south of Crete.

29. The Arabs who seized the Bank of America in Boirut continue to hold up to 40 people as hostages while negotiations continue with bank officials and Lebanese officials. The four are demanding the release of Palestinian guerrillas from Lebanese jails, the payment of a \$4 million ransom, and an airliner to fly them to Algeria. The attackers, who say they are members of the Socialist Revolutionary Movement, say the ransom money is destined to help the Arab war effort. Bank of America headquarters has given permission to its Beirut manager to negotiate a ransom payment, but has refused another request from the raiders for foreigners to be sent in from outside to use as hostages. Most of the hostages being held are believed to be Lebanese, but the US Embassy has learned that one is a US citizen.
