SUBJECT :	New Series of Sensitive DDO Reports

1. Today we are issuing the first report based on a SECRET Soviet publication which has not heretofore been available to the U. S. Intelligence Community. It is called Information Collection of the Headquarters and the Technical Committee of the Combined Armed Forces. This journal is published by Warsaw Pact headquarters in Moscow, and consists of articles by Warsaw Pact officers or the staff of Warsaw Pact headquarters. The journal was initiated in December 1970 and is published once or twice a year.

2. We hope to be able to provide articles from this publication on a continuing basis. Since the subject matter and source sensitivity are similar to those of our special series of reports of articles from <u>Military</u> <u>Thought</u>, we are planning to handle this new series in the same way--that is, classified TOP SECRET, carrying full dissemination controls, and distributed on a must-know basis to designated individuals. I request, therefore, that you handle this new report series in the same way you handle the <u>Military</u> Thought series within your agency.
