Dear Mr. Lindsey:

Thank you very much for your letter WH-76-0302 dated 5 February 1976. You will note that your letter indicated an additional amount of \$1,500.50 for lost tool claims. However, I could not accept your offer in full settlement of my P/E claim.

The items shown in my last claim were based on the report submitted in Saigon, and many items are not included in my previous claim and were abandoned during the emergency evacuation.

Please review my letter dated 24 January 1976 concerning my loss and misfortune as a result of AAM's evacuation and AACL's separation. A petition written in Chinese to Premier Chang Ching Kuo will be translated into English and will be sent to the American Embassy in Taipei, and to you in order to let you have a better and more complete understanding of the entire situation during the evacuation in Vietnam. This petition is signed by all (51) Chinese employees stationed in Saigon (a photostatic copy of this petition, in Chinese, is attached). This petition states that "all these loyal Chinese employees stayed at their posts and risked their lives to protect the best interests of the company's properties to the last minute".

I requested Mr. Wengenroth to write a letter to certify my claims and I hope you have received this letter. I bought a 50 Oscilloscope 585 in Saigon for \$2,000. This test equipment will provide me a better life in TV repairing in Taiwan, in case of seperation by AACL. Now I have lost everything, including my job at AACL, and my misfortune will bring me a lot of hardship.

I request your reconsideration of my claim and your early reply will be highly appreciated.
