

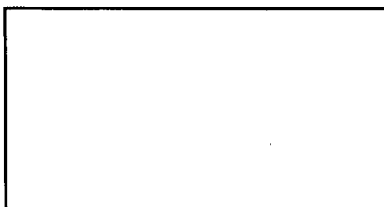

ISRAEL: Political Poll Results

[redacted] A recent poll indicates that a significant majority of Israelis are satisfied with the Begin government's efforts toward peace.

[redacted] A poll published Sunday by a major Israeli newspaper showed that 54 percent of those questioned believe the government is doing all it can to achieve peace, while another 15 percent feel the government is doing "more or less" everything necessary. The poll also disclosed that 63 percent of those surveyed believe the chances of peace are better under Prime Minister Begin's administration than under the previous Labor government; only 7 percent feel chances for peace are worse now.

[redacted] Although the questions in this poll differ from those in one taken on 26 July, one week after the talks at Leeds, England, both indicate solid majorities supporting Begin's conduct in the negotiations. [redacted]
