- 1. DURING CONVERSATION WITH SHAH AFTER PRESENTATION
 CREDENTIALS ON 5 APRIL, HE ASKED THAT I PASS FOLLOWING TO
 PRESIDENT ONLY AND NOT TO STATE DEPARTMENT. FOREIGN MINISTER
 KHALATBARI, ONLY OTHER PERSON PRESENT, WAS ALSO HEARING THIS
 INFORMATION FOR FIRST TIME.
- 2. DURING VISIT TO IRAN IN MID-MARCH, KOSYGIN OFFERED SHAH QUOTE MIG-25'S AND T-65'S UNQUOTE. WHEN MY EYEBROWS WENT UP AT NOMENCLATURE, SHAH SAID QUOTE WHEN HE GOT NO REACTION FROM ME, HE BEGAN TO TALK ABOUT MIG-23'S AND T-62'S ALTHOUGH THE TANK HE WAS DESCRIBING HAD 120 MM. GUNS AND I BELIEVE T-62 HAS ONLY 115 MM ONES. IN ANY EVENT I BELIEVE HE USED THE HIGH NUMBERS AT THE OUTSET TO EXCITE ME, WHICH OBVIOUSLY FAILED. MY READING OF THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE OFFER IS THAT IF HE COULD SELL MIG-23'S TO IRAN, THEN HE WOULD HAVE NO DIFFICULTY IN INTRODUCING THEM INTO THE ARAB STATES OF THE REGION. I CAN ONLY ASSUME THAT THIS IS WHAT
