1. Pursuant to requests made in reference, we ask that you pass attachment, sent under separate cover, to G-2. As you will note therefrom, we want to make it crystal clear to G-2 that, as [ ] says, we are not engaged in a historical research project but rather a vital security matter.

2. Since G-2 will now know that [ ] [ ] have discussed the case per HEID 1643, we assume that there will be a green light given on the search for and the release of any and all relevant reports on file in Stuttgart. We ask that ULS advise GLS of the steps G-2 takes and the timing involved so that timely prods can be given from that end if necessary. When the reports are located they should be given direct to GLS for transmittal to FOB and thence to Headquarters.

3. If any problems develop, I am of course prepared to discuss them in Heidelberg or Stuttgart, as the case may be.

MEMORANDUM FOR: G-2, OSABER

RE: Discussion Between Representatives of G-2 and SDJ in Heidelberg, 10 June 1957

1. Following the discussion mentioned above and also your memorandum to BHD in Heidelberg, [redacted] discussed the ALBERT case with [redacted] in Washington. The latter gave us such information as he was able however there were many details which he could not recall. Although we know that CIC did not receive written reports from ALBERT, [redacted] has stated that there are reports on file which are allegedly [redacted]'s written accounts of material supplied verbally to him by ALBERT. These are assumed by [redacted] to be retained still at 66th CIC headquarters in Stuttgart.

2. As will be appreciated, a thoroughgoing analysis of BHD security factors is largely dependent upon the extent of detailed information available. It is our belief, in which [redacted] concurs, that the SCHMITZ reports to our undertaking, in this connection, missing details necessary to our undertaking. In this connection, it will be recalled that [redacted] emphasized at the time of our meeting on 10 June that our interest in the ALBERT case is not a matter of one but rather is it an effort to examine closely several problems of BHD security involving possible high level penetration of West organizations. This is clearly a matter concerning American interests as well as German.

3. For the above reasons, we request your assistance and continued cooperation in having a search made of the pertinent files for all information in written form pertaining to SCHMITZ's relations with ALBERT and the data learned from the latter about the BHD and the personnel, when the reports are located, we ask that they be passed directly to DAD/Stuttgart.
