1. Reference is made to Agent Report, Region IV, Munich, Subject: Bulgarian Intelligence Service, re: Theodor Hafel, file D-567322/f, dated 21 June 1956, and Ops Memo 6/56, your Headquarters, dated 30 April 1956.
2. Forwarded herewith is Agent Report, Region IV, Munich, Subject and file as above, dated 1 August 1956.
3. Control of information is as follows:
 - a. Source A-IV is Dr. Theodor von Albert, evaluated "B".
 - b. Source B-IV is Hermann Mueller, formerly of Munich, evaluated "B".
 - c. Agency A-IV is Region IV, Munich, and Agency B-IV is the US Air Force Screening Center, Barchtesgaden, Germany.
 - d. The reporting agent is Earl D. Morris, Region IV, Munich.
 - e. Case is pending in the Region IV area.
4. Source A-IV formerly headed the Austrian network of the Institut fuer Gegenwartsforschung - IIG, a German intelligence organization then commonly referred to as Amt Blank, which ceased operations in Austria after the ratification of the Austrian State Treaty. He has been employed by the US Air Force in Barchtesgaden, since February 1956.

SUBJ: Yugoslavian Intelligence Service (C) Re; Proposed Informant Network

5. As instructed by your Headquarters, Source A-IV was contacted in Salzburg on 17 and 18 July 1956, paid 4000 Austrian schillings - AS, and instructed to reactivate his former Bulgarian informant network in Austria. Since then he has contacted Velitschko Mizaikoff, key personality in Vienna and instructed him according to the Region IV target in that field. Source A-IV expects to receive progress reports from Mizaikoff on approximately 1 August 1956, which he will immediately forward to this Region.

CIT BULGARIA? MBE INFORMANT NET THEODO VON ALBERT

6. Source A-IV is well aware that this Region will not consider employing his unidentified friend in Graz, or the latter's alleged intelligence network, without the identity of the personalities involved being known to this Region. Since he has given his word to his friend that his identity will not be disclosed without his permission, Source A-IV feels obligated not to disclose his identity. The possibility exists, however, that if Source A-IV arranges a meeting between his friend and a representative of this Region, his identity may become known.

7. It is believed by this Region that since Source A-IV has previously controlled a Yugoslavian informant network in Austria, and since he is a Serbo-Croatian linguist, his services in this field will prove to be of value to this Region. It is proposed by this Region to commission Source A-IV to utilize the network of personalities contained in the attached report, for a period of three months, at a cost of 4000 AS per month, to determine the capabilities of such a network. It is believed by this Region that Source A-IV is capable of operating this network, along with the Bulgarian intelligence network.

8. It is requested that your Headquarters notify this Region as expeditiously as possible as to whether Source A-IV should also activate the proposed Yugoslavian network, on the terms listed in the attached report. Your opinion is also desired as to the eventual employment of Source A-IV, as a full time employee, on the terms noted in the report.

9. On 18 July 1956, the reporting agent introduced Source A-IV to George H. Gilmore, Region IV, Munich, who became the handling agent of Source A-IV.

10. The files of this Region contain no record of the Yugoslavian personalities mentioned in the attached report, other than the following:

CPI Card dated 8 October 1953 lists (Dr) Ismail Batic, CIT YUGOSLAVIA, Vienna, as being a sub-source of Theodor von Albert, member of the Austrian net of the IIG. He was born 26 August 1920 in Mostar, Yugoslavia, is a journalist by profession, has a degree in oriental languages, and is the Near East co-worker of the IIG.
