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AMENDMENTS TO STATE DEPARTMENT PLAN

It was apparent that the Secretaries of War and Navy had a number of objections to the McCormack plan, and in the absence of the Secretary of State Mr. McCormack made some revisions which he submitted on 15 December.

The paper is of particular significance because it brings out the reason for opposing the establishment of an independent agency which, it was felt, could not obtain budgetary support. It makes clear why, when the Presidential Directive was finally issued, financial support was to be drawn from the departments even though the independent existence of the CIG was established. It also demonstrates why the Central Intelligence Agency must be established by act of Congress if it to achieve the financial independence which experience had demonstrated that it needs.

Advisory Groups or Boards

The State Department has proposed two "Advisory Groups," one for "Intallignmes," compared of full-time representatives of the G.2, the DHI and the AG/AS-2, and the other for "Security," compared of full-time representatives of the Ghief Coordinator, Treasury Bulk securit Apandes, the AG of 5, G-2, the DHI and the Director of the HHI. The Far Department has expressed the view that these arrangements do not inserve that the G-2, DHI and AG/AS-2 will be brought in as makers of

It was not the State Department's intention to minimize the role of the Service Intalligence Chiefs. It was thought that, mines they would be represented in the central organisation at every level, they would perticipate fully in the development of the maticaal intalli-gence program and of all operating plane designed to every it est.

Purther, it was the State Department view, and it still is, that through a board of officers assigned full-time to the job of assisting the Recentive Secretary, the G-2, DHI and J-2 would have a fuller and more effective participation in the eaniral agency than if they sat arready as a "board of directory" holding cocondanal mawings and year ing on finished papers. A full-time Matterry fromp or Beard would be part of the office of the Recentive Secretary, would be functions while which the thinking of that office, would have time to study all plane and programs in detail, and could do much to bring the Secretaries and the departmental intelligence agencies to a common point of view. ato ting

However, it is recognized that the Ker and Mary Departments have a right to specify who their representatives on the Advisory Beards will be, and it is therefore proposed to smend the plan so as to leave the Mar and Mary Departments and the Army Mir Forces free to hypoint their Intelligence Chiefs as part-time members or to appoint some other representatives as either full-time or part-time members, whichever wy prove to be best.
