CARBOHIDRATS Progress Report

Ref : HGBA-16064, MGQM-14910

Synopsis: This memorandum describes the developments in the CARBOHYDRATE operation since the redirection of the project outlined in reference 1. No requests are contained in this report.

1. Since reference 1 was sublitted to Headquarters, the proposal has been made to CARBONIDENTS that his work for up be redirected along the lines contained in reference. It was emplained to him that while higher headquarters has in the past valued the information submitted by him concerning the East Berlin police organisation, the police itself is not now considered a target of primary importance. It was emphasized that CARBONIDENTS himself could in no way be held responsible for this development, but, at the same time, headquarters is of the opinion that information regarding the Barlin police is not of sufficient interest to warrant the retention of CARBONIDENTS solely for its procurement. It was explained that this whole problem is now subject to review since headquarters, in view of the United States Government's large scale expenditures in European economic aid and rearmament, is a stempting to reduce its budget wherever possible. CARBONIDENTS was informed that we appreciate his past services and feel that he can be of assistance to us in the future, although it has become necessary to reduce his monthly salary and to redirect his work. He was thereupon effered a salary of 300 BM Mest per month, 200 to be paid him in cash and 100 to be deposited to his holding account.

2. GARBORNDRATE was, as might be expected, disappointed at the prospect of receiving a reduction in salary, although he was quick to point out that he had for some time been aware of his decreased production and wished that he could be of greater assistance to us. At the same time, he stated that he had been motivated by ideological considerations to contact us originally in the spring of 1948 and that he still felt these considerations to be more important than the material remneration which he has received while in our employ. In short, he accepted the reduced salary basis and agreed to continue to work for the common cause in any way in which he could.

3. GARBOHYDRATS was then informed that we should continue to want any pertiment information on the Soviet Sector police organization, including personnel

changes and policies, structural alterations, etc., as well as information to which he might have access concerning planned SED and FDJ demonstrations in Mest Barlin. He was told, however, that from now on our principal interest will be the location of possible leads into the HTDVP and HVA and information pertaining to DDR identification cards and passes, methods of document control and travel restrictions. CARBOHYDRATE voiced his agreement with this outline of his future work for us, and he submitted, before leaving on his mumal vacation, two reports, HDB-10106 and HDB-13930, which deal with control of the Deutscher Personalansweis and with DDR police restrictions concerning travel to the Baltic coastal areas. We have also been informed by '_______ in HOQI-6978, dated 1 July 1952, that his office is desirous of Procuring, on T continuing basis, copies of Die Velkropolisei, which CARBOHYDRATE has submitted in the past and will continue to submit.

A. It was pointed out in reference 1 that CARBONTDRATE is at present the only BOB source able to perform baric name and address checks, through police files. on East Sector residents of operational interest to us. On the basis of points mentioned in paragraphs 3 and h sheve, and since CARBONIDRATE has expressed his willingness to continue in our suplay at a reduced salary, it is recommended that he be maintained on agent status by BOB. A revised Field Project Outline was submitted to Meadquarters as MOBA-16073 to cover the agent's activity from Sume through September 1952; a new FFO will be written to dover the CARBONIDEATE Project after the latter date.

6. As was mentioned above, CARBONTHATE is presently on vacation, and the next scheduled meeting with him is set for 22 August 1952.
