1. CARBOHYDRATS delivered the following material:

a. Report written by Dr. Berger re the most recent approach/by the \$15. On 8 Apr. he was visited by his sister-in-law from the DDR who had been sent by his mother and father-in-law to fill in details on the recent approach to them by the SFS for the purpose of game inducing them to persuade Berger to return to the DIR. An SIS official from the Halle office (not the East Berlin office) visited the mother-in-law on 30 March to discuss her daughter, Berger's wife, who lives with him in the West Berlin. The SPS officer was polite, requested the mother-in-law to induce headaughter to visit Maumberg (in the .DR). She was assured the right to return to West Berlin any time she wanted. Themselberg Preferably, however, the mother-in-law could persuade Dr. Berger and his wife to return to the DDR permanently. He would receive a good position in Halle, etc. Dr. John was mentioned as holding a good position in the Mank East, as well as Schmidt-Wittmack. The mother-in-law had fended off an immediate trip to West Berlin by noting her current plans to visit Berger and wife on 20 May in any case. The SFS officer was satisfied, expressed desire to meet nothin-inplay again on 16 May. It is worth noting that this is the third attempt vis-a-vis immgenrBerger that the SFS has made. - 2. In connection with the wisit to Dr. Berger by his management sistendam noted above, EMERNICAN CARBO reported orally that Berger had received on the same day as this meeting a call from a former sub-renter of his Halle Apt. who is still residing in the DDR. Berger went to meet with the woman at 1600 at a restaurant at Fittenbergplats. No more details were known, however, at the time of the meeting. Full report to follow later.

 COMMANT: This is the Fourth approach to Berger. Emerican managementally become mounted by the Halle office of the SFS. This is in sharp contrast to the usual practice, which is for the East Berlin office to travel to arricus parts of the DDR, if necessary, to interview friends or relatived of CADROIT staffers and give them REI's re the staffers concerned. The previously reported approach to Frl. Kirchner through her DDR esiding mother, for example, took blace as follows: the East Berlin 878 traveled to the immen countryside means term where the mother resided, spoke with the mother, brought her to last Berlin by car, and sent her to west Berlin to visit her daughter. This difference of approach in the Berger case might possibly help be explain the persistence of the SFS vis-a-vis Berger (i.e., the Halle office is descented only with Berger, not all other CADROIT staffers, and had received some ment of dissective to take all action possible to CADROID.
