NINETEENTH DISTRICT.—COUNTIES: Andrews, Bailey, Castro, Cochran, Dawson, Deaf Smith, Gaines, Hale, Hockley, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Martin, Midland, Parmer, Terry, and Yoakum. BECTOR COUNTY: That part included in census tracts, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 24, and 25, and that part of census tract 21 east of U.S. Highway 385 and north of the Texas & Pacific Railroad. Population (1970), 476,980.

GEORGE H. MAHON, Democrat, Lubbock, Tex.; born September 22, 1900, near Haynesville, La., son of J. K. and Lola Brown Mahon; moved to Mitchell County, Tex., 1908; reared on a farm; attended rural school, graduated from Loraine High School; B.A., Simmons University, Abilene, 1924; LL.B., University of Texas, 1925; attended University of Minnesota in 1925; honorary LL.D. 1961 Waynesburg College, Pennsylvania; honorary LL.D. 1960 Wayland Baptist College, Plainview, Tex.; honorary LL.D. 1962 Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Tex.; honorary LL.D. 1964 Hardin-Simmons University, Abilene, Tex.; honorary LL.D. 1965 Pepperdine College, Los Angeles, Calif.; married Helen Stevenson, of Loraine, Tex., 1923; one daughter—Daphne, born 1927; elected county attorney, Mitchell County, 1926; appointed district attorney, 1927; elected county attorney, Mitchell County, 1926; appointed district attorney 1928, 1930, 1932; thirty-second judicial district, 1927; elected district attorney 1928, 1930, 1932; received American Political Science Association Congressional Distinguished Service Award in 1963; received the George Washington award of the American Good Government Society in 1969; elected in 1934 to 74th Congress and reelected to each succeeding Congress; became chairman of Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives in 1964, continuing in that capacity through the 93d Congress; chairman of the Joint Senate-House Committee on Reduction of Federal Expenditures; Regent of the Smithsonian Institution; in 1968 served on the President's Commission on Budget Concepts.

TWENTIETH DISTRICT.—BEXAR COUNTY: Core of the city of San Antonio only, roughly the old city limits lines; other parts of the city now in either the Twenty-first or Twenty-third Districts. Population (1970), 467,942.

HENRY B. GONZALEZ, Democrat, of San Antonio, Tex.; born in San Antonio, May 3, 1916, son of Leonides (deceased) and Genevieve Gonzalez, descendants of the original colonists of the State of Durango in northern Mexico, who fled their country as the result of the revolution and moved to San Antonio in 1911; attended the San Antonio public schools, San Antonio College, University of Texas, and St. Mary's University School of Law (LL.B.) which conferred on him an honorary Doctor of Laws degree in 1965; first elected to public office in 1953; served 3 years on the San Antonio City Council, serving as mayor pro temp part of the second term; served as chief probation officer of Bexar County; worked for bilingual publications, San Antonio Housing Authority, and once taught math and citizenship classes in the San Antonio night school program; elected to the State senate of Texas in 1956 and reelected in 1960; married Bertha Cuellar in 1940 and they have 4 boys and 4 girls; Henry, Rose Mary (Mrs. Jesus Ramos), Charles, Bertha (Mrs. Terry Denzer), Stephen, Genevieve (Mrs. Ruben Singleterry), Francis, and Anna Maria, and eight grandchildren; elected to 87th Congress on November 4, 1961, to fill the unexpired term of Paul J. Kilday; reelected to the 88th, 89th, 90th, 91st, 92d, and 93d Congresses; member of the Banking and Currency Committee; chairman, Subcommittee on International Finance; has served six times as a House delegate to the U.S.-Mexico Interparliamentary Conference; member, National Commission on Consumer Finance.

Population (1970), 466,656.

O. CLARK FISHER, Democrat, of San Angelo, Tex.; member House Armed Services Committee; elected to 78th and succeeding Congresses.
