1. In compliance with a telephonic request from Lt. Commander C. B. Harding, USNR, the following information on the subject-named officers is forwarded for the Truman Committee investigation:

Commander John Ford, USNR

John Ford held a reserve commission as Lt. Commander in the United States Naval Reserve for the past eight years. He was one of the founders of a Naval Reserve Photographic Unit attached to the 11th Naval District. This unit was organized in December 1940. Lt. Commander Ford was called to active duty on 15 September 1941 in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations with additional duty in the Office of The Coordinator of Information (now Office of Strategic Services).

Lt. Commander Ford was promoted to Commander, USNR, on 15 October 1941.

Commander Ford has been long recognized as one of the most outstanding motion picture directors of the motion picture industry. The last company for which he directed pictures was Twentieth Century-Fox Film Corporation, where he worked on a free lance basis receiving a flat fee for directing. His last picture was "How Green Was My Valley" which was completed in July 1941. His salary for this picture was \$100,000.

At the present time he is still receiving dividends from several pictures which he directed on a percentage basis, these namely being:

"The Lost Patrol" - R.K.O.
 "The Defender" - R.K.O.
 "Stage Coach" - United Artists

These percentage dividends are now averaging approximately \$2,000 yearly, on a diminishing basis.

John Ford holds 50 shares of stock in the Argosy Corporation, a corporation which was formed for the production of motion pictures. This corporation produced one motion picture, "The Long Voyage Home," which Ford directed. The Argosy Corporation is not operating at present and has suspended production for the duration. Ford does not own any other motion picture stock.

Lieutenant Gregg W. Toland, USNR

Lieutenant Toland was last employed by Samuel Goldwyn, and his employment in the motion picture industry has been continuous for the past 17 years as a motion picture cinematographer. Lieut. Toland was commissioned in the U. S. Naval Reserve on January 21, 1941, and held on inactive status as a member of the Photographic Unit, Naval Reserve Forces, attached to the 11th Naval District, Los Angeles. He was ordered to active duty by the Chief of Naval Operations for additional duty with The Coordinator of Information, now the Office of Strategic Services, and reported for duty on December 15, 1941.

Mr. Toland's salary with Samuel Goldwyn was \$40,000 per year. At the present time he is receiving no compensation from Samuel Goldwyn nor has he at any time since he has been on active service. He holds no stock in Samuel Goldwyn's corporation nor possesses any other motion picture stock. Lieut. Toland's contract with Mr. Goldwyn has been suspended, and upon discharge from the Naval Reserve, Mr. Goldwyn guarantees Mr. Toland, without options, 39 months employment at \$8,000 per month.

Lieutenant Sol Halprin, USNR

In 1918 he started at Fox Film Studios as assistant head of the laboratory and has been continuously employed by that studio in various camera and technical capacities. In 1927 he was made photographic head of the Process Department at the 20th Century-Fox Studios and was there until called to active duty on December 15, 1941.

Mr. Halprin was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the U. S. Naval Reserve on January 5, 1941, and held on inactive status as a member of the Photographic Unit, Naval Reserve Forces, attached to the 11th Naval District, Los Angeles.

Lieut. Halprin was ordered to active duty by the Chief of Naval Operations for additional duty with The Coordinator of Information (now the Office of Strategic Services) and reported for duty on December 16, 1941. Mr. Halprin's salary when called to active duty from 20th Century-Fox Studios was \$375 per week. His contract has been suspended and still has seven months to run upon his release from the Naval Reserve.

Lieut. Halprin does not own any stock in the Fox Film Corporation or in any other motion picture company.

Lieutenant Arthur Edward Arling, USNR

Lieutenant Arling was director of photography for Technicolor Motion Picture Corporation during 1940 and 1941. Previous experience in technicolor and black and white motion picture photography as operative cameraman on many of Hollywood's top pictures, including the Academy Award winner, "Gone with the Wind." Graduated from New York Institute of Photography in 1936. Member of the American Society of Cinematographers.

Mr. Arling was commissioned as a Lieutenant (jg) in the U. S. Naval Reserve on January 5, 1941, and held an inactive status as a member of the Photographic Unit, Naval Reserve Forces, attached to the 11th Naval District, Los Angeles. He was ordered to active duty by the Chief of Naval Operations for additional duty with The Coordinator of Information (now Office of Strategic Services) and reported for duty on December 16, 1941.

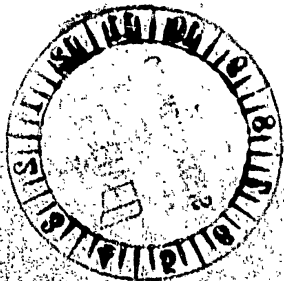





SUBJECT:

Mr. E. Bright Wilson calls attention to the investigation of civilian personnel which will be carried out by the Civil Service Committee of the House under the chairmanship of Representative Ramspeck of Georgia and to the appointment of Mr. Dillard Lasseter to direct the investigation.

Representative Ramspeck made the following statement regarding Mr. Lasseter in an extension of remarks in the Congressional Record of February 8, 1943 (p. A484):

"This staff director comes to the committee with a background of broad experience in business and Government. He is a native of my own State, and I have known him for many years. I have the utmost confidence in his ability, his integrity, and his capacity.

"His business experience consists of sales work, sales promotion, and corporate reorganization in the textile field. He has been admitted to the bar of Georgia but never engaged in the practice of law.

"For a while he taught public administration and administrative law at Emory University in Atlanta. He is a graduate of Emory with a bachelor of arts degree and received his master of

arts degree from New York University.

"His governmental experience covers important administrative positions with the National Recovery Administration, the National Youth Administration, and the War Manpower Commission. He was also in the Foreign Service of the United States Department of State for several years.

"This varied and extensive experience fits him, in my opinion, for the great task in which the Civil Service Committee will be engaged.

"He is an old-fashioned American, with a progressive point of view."

Informal and confidential inquiry of the Foreign Service Personnel Office at the State Department has elicited reply that Mr. Lasseter's record is good. He entered the Foreign Service as a Student Interpreter in 1916 and in 1917 was granted leave of absence to enable him to serve in the Army. He returned to the Foreign Service in 1920 and remained until 1923 when he resigned on account of ill health resulting from serious injuries incurred during his military service.

Will you please take up with Senator Byrd the matter of his questionnaire forwarded to me under date of November 11, together with letter of November 17 requesting information regarding number of employees, payroll, classifications, etc. of U.S.S. His letter specifically requests names, salaries, specific duties, educational and experience background of all employees receiving more than \$2500 per annum.

Because of the fact that a very large proportion of all of the employees of the U.S.S. are engaged in work of a highly secret nature, I consider it would be against the public interest to divulge this information. Even the questionnaire, divulging as it would, the number of employees and the total payroll of the U.S.S., should not, in my opinion, be made public.

It is impossible to give this information and at the same time maintain the absolutely essential secrecy of this office and its operations.
